CLEARPATH ACTION COMMENTS ON WHITE HOUSE EFFORT TO SUPPORT U.S. NUCLEAR FLEET

WASHINGTON, DC -- ClearPath Action Executive Director released the following statement regarding the White House Memorandum on the Effect of Uranium Imports on the National Security and Establishment of the United States Nuclear Fuel Working Group.

"The White House decision over the weekend will help U.S. companies maintain our existing nuclear energy fleet by not adding new layers of costs," said ClearPath Action Executive Director Rich Powell. "Preserving our existing nuclear fleet is good for the economy, national security, and importantly for lowering carbon emissions."

The memorandum establishes a Nuclear Fuel Working Group, chaired by National Security Advisor Ambassador John Bolton and Director of the National Economic Council Larry Kudlow, to look at domestic nuclear fuel production and how it can boost the U.S. nuclear fleet. According to the White House, this working group will report its findings in 90 days and will remain consistent national security and nonproliferation goals.
